Growth of business empires should not compromise on the fundamental rights of vulnerable citizens and thus, it becomes important to have a value based business education scheme. The preamble to the Constitution of India lays emphasis on Justicepolitical, social and economic. According to **Dr. B.R. Ambedkar**, the term "social justice" is based upon equality, liberty and fraternity of all human beings. The aim of social justice is to remove all kinds of inequalities based upon caste, race, sex, power, position, and wealth. Thus, social justice brings equal distribution

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of the social, political and economic resources of the community. The Constitution of India is a remedial answer to the system of age-old social injustice in the form of caste system. It also provides special rights and protection to women, children and other weaker sections of the society. Thus, the Democratic Republic of India stands for the good of all the people and embodies the concept of a Welfare State. The economic justice assured by the Preamble can hardly be achieved if the democracy envisaged by the Constitution were confined to a political democracy. Dr. Radhakrishnan has put it-

"Poor people who wander about, find no work, no wages and starve, whose lives are a Continual round of sore affliction and pinching poverty, cannot be proud of the constitution or its law."

The ideal of economic justice is to make equality of status meaningful and life worth living at its best removing inequality of opportunity and of status- social, economic and political. Social Justice is the comprehensive form to remove social imbalance and will build up a welfare state. Combining the ideals of political, social and economic democracy with that of equality and fraternity, the Preamble seeks to establish what **Mahatma Gandhi** described as "the India of my dreams", namely

"An India, in which the poorest shall feel that it is their country in whose making an effective voice, an India in which all communities shall live in perfect harmony."

Therefore, the Constitution was envisaged to be a document creating a social democracy that would meet the compelling needs of all strata of Indian community.

I tell you this, because as young managers you must ensure that the organizations you work for respect and incorporate these constitutional values. And with the kind of education that you have been able to get in this institution, each one of you has the ability to visualize and create a future where there is equality of opportunity in all spheres.

The population of our country being

1.25 billion strong by no stretch of imagination can be said that we lack man power. The problem lies in quality and not quantity of manpower. Virtually every industry from IT, retail, finance, telecommunication, manufacturing and biotechnology is struggling to find skilled workers and managers as they expand. Keeping this in mind, I hope that in the future every young Indian should be able to augment their skills and better develop their acumen to the fullest. Able mangers will influence every facet of an organization and enable it to expand. Every industry that touches our daily lives is brought to life by the managers who tirelessly exert to ensure that goals of the organization are achieved and society is serviced.

In the last 68 years, the Indian Economy has grown in all segments. Innovation and entrepreneurship is no longer a matter of choice for any developing country. It is an urgent necessity for economic growth, widening the scope of employment, poverty alleviation and raising the living standards of one and all. The scope for your future employment is unlimited, as the society is in need of many skilled personnel to provide basic amenities such as clean environment, sanitation, water supply, road and building infrastructure, food and clothing, housing, energy requirements, green products and medical devices at an affordable cost. The institutional goal has to be aimed not only in elevating the academic standards of individual. rural and urban wards but also in societal welfare. You have the supreme task of bridging the gap between rural and urban

communities.

Young managers like you have innumerable opportunities ahead of you. You are a part of a world which is constantly shrinking due to globalization. Cities and cultures have become more interconnected than ever before and commerce has played a vital role in traversing past geographic boundaries. As managers you must also be aware of your position as a global citizen. Globalization has shown that the problems of the world are also interconnected and thus, the solutions must also come from all corners of the world. Challenges of environmental sustainability have also extended to the entrepreneurial society. But well trained professionals like you have the potency to create a new world that is free from these hurdles.

Winston Churchill once pointed out that "he used to list out all the worries in a small piece of paper. If there are six worries in the list, two are very difficult to overcome, two can be sorted out and the remaining two are not real worries at all. The first two are difficult to solve.

So, there is no point in pondering over it." Therefore students, you must avoid a negative approach in life. Face the challenges that come your way with absolute resolve and positivity. Let each challenge serve as a learning lesson. Alertness. activeness and academic improvement must be on your minds day in and day out. You are becoming a graduate, not only by your own efforts but also by the relentless support of society including the efforts of your parents, academic authorities, agricultural and industrial workers. It is your bounden duty to pay back this debt of gratitude by improving the economic and social standards of people in the society around you. Aim higher, work hard and elevate yourself to be on the apex in life. Be persistent in your efforts and success will follow.
